Absentee Ballot Voting Information:

Are you going to be out of town on November 26? You can still vote in the Runoff Election. Go to your Circuit Clerk's office to vote by absentee ballot between 8:00 a.m.—5:00 p.m. Monday through Friday—or—on Saturday, November 16 or Saturday, November 23, you can vote by absentee ballot at your Circuit Clerk's office between 8:00 a.m.—12:00 noon.

Background Information:

This race is in Supreme Court District 1 (commonly referred to as the central district) but the Justices on the Supreme Court hear cases from ALL parts of the state. If you live in the following counties, you can vote in the Supreme Court Runoff Election: Bolivar, Claiborne, Copiah, Hinds, Holmes, Humphreys, Issaquena, Jefferson, Kemper, Lauderdale, Leake, Madison, Neshoba, Newton, Noxubee, Rankin, Scott, Sharkey, Sunflower, Warren, Washington, Yazoo.
